France: Google is imposed a 50 million euros fine under GDPR regulations

On January 21st 2019, the French Data Protection Authority* imposed a 50 Million euros fine against GOOGLE LLC. This is the first decision ever issued in France since the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) came into force on May 25th 2018.

The decision has been issued further to complaints filed by two non-profit organizations, *None of your business* and *La Quadrature du Net*. The CNIL has ruled that Google has violated (I) the obligations of transparency and information and (ii) the obligation to have a legal basis for ads personalization processing.
